The Ten Essentials (for safety, survival and basic comfort) 1. Navigation 6. Repair kit and tools ☐ Sunscreen and lip balm ☐ Knife or multi-tool ☐ Sunglasses ☐ Duct tape strips; repair items as needed 3. Insulation 8. Nutrition ☐ Jacket, vest, pants, gloves, hat (see Clothing) ☐ Extra day's supply of food 4. Illumination 9. Hydration ☐ Headlamp or flashlight ☐ Water bottles or hydration system (insulated) Extra batteries ☐ Water filter or other treatment system 5. First-aid supplies 10. Emergency shelter ☐ First-aid kit (see our First-aid checklist) ☐ Tent, tarp, bivy or reflective blanket **Beyond the Ten Essentials** ☐ Backpack ☐ Personal locator beacon (PLB) ☐ Avalanche transceiver □ Daypack or summit pack ☐ 4-season tent, or tarp or bivy sack ☐ Avalanche probe ☐ Snow or tent stakes and guylines ☐ Slope meter ☐ Tent-pole repair sleeve ☐ Snow shovel ☐ Footprint (if needed for tent) ☐ Snow saw ☐ Sleeping bag (liner optional) □ Meals ☐ Stuff sack or compression sack ☐ Energy food (bars, gels, chews, trail mix) ☐ 2 sleeping pads per person (+ optional chair kit) ☐ Energy beverages or drink mixes ☐ Pillow or stuffable pillow case ☐ Stove □ Fuel ☐ Packable lantern ☐ Cookset with large pot (for melting snow) ☐ Snowshoes or crampons ☐ Skis (with skins) ☐ Dishes or bowls ☐ Crampons ☐ Utensils ☐ Ice axe ☐ Cups (measuring cups) ☐ Trekking poles (w/snow baskets) ☐ Pot grabber ☐ Multifunction watch with altimeter ☐ Food-storage sacks or canister ☐ Signaling mirror (often on compass) ☐ 50-foot nylon cord ☐ Whistle ☐ Backup water treatment (e.g., halogens) Clothing ☐ Base layer: wicking underwear ☐ Insulating hat, cap or headband ☐ Mid layer: insulating jacket/vest/pants ☐ Balaclava and/or face mask ☐ Shell: Rain jacket (or soft shell) ☐ Goggles ☐ Rain pants (of soft-shell pants) ☐ Gloves and/or mittens ☐ Dry clothing for camp ☐ Waterproof overmitts Footwear; assorted personal options □ Boots ☐ Main socks, liner socks, spare socks ☐ Guidebook; interpretive field guide(s) □ Camera ☐ Gaiters Camp booties ☐ Binoculars □ Bandana or buff ☐ Two-way radios ☐ Toilet paper + sanitation trowel ☐ Cell or satellite phone ☐ Hand sanitizer + quick-dry towel ☐ Music player with headphones ☐ Toothbrush and/or toiletry kit ☐ Small amount of cash or credit card ■ Notebook and pen or pencil ☐ Trip itinerary left w/friend + under car seat
